Thank you to all the coaches, managers and trainers that have donated countless hours of their time to our association.

We received 143 coaching evaluations equaling last year's response. We received some constructive feedback on the evaluations. These reviews were very valuable when considering prospective coaches for the 2014/2015 season.

Coaching Applications were accepted until March 15th for Tyke-Major Midget age groups. Coaches were selected by the Coaching Selection Committee. The Committee consists of the President, V.P Coaching, V.P. Rep, V.P Local League, and V.P Player Development. We will be accepting applications for AE coaches upon completion of the A/AA tryouts.

Once again the dinner will be held at the Elmira Golf Club. We anticipate 95-100 attendees.

VP PLAYER DEVELOPMENT FRED HALE / KEVIN SCHMITT



This past year a number of player and coach development initiatives were introduced.

Each rep team from Tyke Select through Minor Bantam (including all AA, A and AE teams in that range) were provided 8 weekday morning power skating sessions. These sessions ran from end of September through mid-January and were designed and led by Woolwich Hockey Academy (WHA). Tony Code and his staff were regularly available to rep coaches to discuss development issues and challenges and to discuss the components of each on ice session. Team coaches not only aided in the instruction but had the opportunity to broaden their own coaching skills and vocabulary by observing WHA staff teaching skating and individual tactics and applying correction. In addition each rep team from Tyke Select through Major Peewee were provided a 90 min practice every other week at 4:00 pm bringing their total practice ice to 4.5 hours for every two week cycle up until the beginning of playoffs.

As well, each rep team from Tyke Select through Major Bantam were provided 8 professionally led goaltender clinics on Saturday mornings from early October through end of January. Sessions were designed and led by Steve Sumka from "Angles Goalie Training". On his recommendation, each team was encouraged to choose a goaltending instructor/facilitator to attend each of these sessions with their team's goaltenders. Combining professional and/or knowledgeable training with a dedicated goaltender coach/facilitator appears to provide the greatest opportunity for development and focus of young goaltenders. We strongly encourage all coaches to follow through on this next year and make the most of this goaltender development initiative.

We offered Local League development on 12 Saturday mornings from Thanksgiving through early January. It was optional and open to all LL players and included 8 power skating sessions and 3 goaltender clinics. We had approximately 12 skaters sign up for the power skating and 5 goaltenders for the goalie clinics. Power Skating sessions were run by WHA and goaltender clinics were run by Angles Goalie Training.

We held two "hitting' or body contact clinics mandatory for all 2001 players as they prepare to re-enter full contact hockey at tryouts in May and regular play next season.

Additionally we doubled the amount of ice offered to our initiation (mini 4, 5s) by adding a regular weekday morning hour of ice time.

Going forward next year we plan to continue with all the above initiatives making adjustments and improvements to the timing, duration, and content of each of these offerings.

As we have in the past few years, we did struggle with registration in the Minor and Major Pee Wee categories and unfortunately had to cancel those divisions.

have spoken about removing the Rep divisions (except AE) from the Tournament, as we do have is these divisions - since Rep Teams in the OMHA are only allowed to enter 2 Tournaments per year the Early Birds, Christmas and March Break tournaments), the competition is strong to make Woolwich West one of the tournaments that teams choose. A decision on the divisions we will host for the Tournament made in May, after some further deliberations. Feedback is always welcome!
