## The CMRG Concussion Management Program: 4 Steps to successful concussion management

**Step 1:** Education and information - CMRG provides education and information to players, parents, leagues and officials on the signs and symptoms of concussion and what to do when a concussion is suspected.

**Step 2:** Neurocognitive testing - CMRG provides baseline and follow-up ImPACT neurocognitive testing. Baseline testing is conducted at the start of the season each year (please see ImPACT information below).

**Step 3:** Proper Medical Management - CMRG has a network of over 240 healthcare providers across the country who are trained in proper concussion management. Once a concussion occurs, we work with the athlete/parent to ensure proper management by one of our medical experts.

**Step 4:** Research - CMRG, through our medical expert network and UWO ethics, work with teams and leagues to collect valuable data on concussion incidents. This information is then presented back to the leagues in order for them to enhance education programs, discuss possible rule or equipment changes, etc.



## Overview and Features of the ImPACT Test

The following information has been used with permission by and under license from ImPACT Applications, Inc. © ImPACT Applications, Inc. 2009-2011.

ImPACT (Immediate Post-Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing) is the first, most-widely used, and most scientifically validated computerized concussion evaluation system.

Developed in the early 1990's by Drs. Mark Lovell and Joseph Maroon, ImPACT is a 20-minute test that has become a standard tool used in comprehensive clinical management of concussions for athletes of all ages. ImPACT Applications, Inc. was co-founded by Mark Lovell, PhD, Joseph Maroon, MD, and Michael (Micky) Collins, PhD.

Given the inherent difficulties in concussion management, it is important to manage concussions on an individualized basis and to implement baseline testing and/or post-injury neurocognitive testing. This type of concussion assessment can help to objectively evaluate the concussed athlete's post-injury condition and track recovery for safe return to play, thus preventing the cumulative effects of concussion. In fact, neurocognitive testing has recently been called the "cornerstone" of proper concussion management by an international panel of sports medicine experts.

## Gearing Up For Rep Tryouts

Welcome to another hockey season in Woolwich.

This year we will have two teams competing at the AA level; our Major Atom and Major PeeWee teams have proven again that they can compete at this level. In saying this, we have also developed many players to be able to compete in AAA level in various centers this year.

New this year is the ruling from Hockey Canada taking body checking out of PeeWee hockey. Body checking will begin in Minor Bantam effective this year.

Woolwich is an A classification center and we will compete at this level with all other registered representative teams. We will also continue to participate with the Additional Player Movement Policy also known as the NRP process (non-resident player) .

Woolwich has made a commitment to participate fully in the Made for Ontario policy with the possibility of 3 non-resident players playing on our Rep Teams from Minor PeeWee to Midget.

The tryouts will be open to all that qualify and have obtained proper forms for the A level teams. All positions are open and if the non-resident players are selected during tryouts by the coaching staff they will be signed to that teams' roster.

If you have any questions regarding this policy or our "Exceptional player" policy please feel free to contact me.



We will continue this year with a one-time tryout fee of \$20 for rep teams that is payable at the first tryout the player attends.

Should a player decide not to participate during the A tryouts, but then start their tryouts at the AE level, they must still pay the \$20 fee.

Please note that anyone wishing to try out for a Rep team, including AE, must be at one of the first three ice times.

It is expected that players will first go to the A level tryout and then to the AE team once released from the A team.

Anyone from Woolwich Township can try out for any team in their age group, but coaches can reduce the numbers after one ice time as they have limited ice available to pick their teams.

Please let your coaches know if you want to be considered for the Rep team at the first skate.
